Keeping you updated

We wanted to provide you with an update on Whiteley Meadows and what you can expect from us over the coming months.

Overview

In addition, the development will provide:

- Provision of extra care facilities which will be delivered by Winchester City Council.
- Play Areas comprising of 2 NEAPs and 4 LEAPs and 21 Playful landscape areas many of which are now open with the final areas opening 2026 with all complete by 2028.
- Comprehensive Green Infrastructure and landscaping including informal green space and habitat enhancement planting is completed across all occupied areas.

Site activity

- 9A is now over halfway through the build stage with the aim to be build complete in December 2026.
- Roads have been complete on Phase 12A.
- All hoggin paths are near completion.
- Works have now started on Allotments 3 & 2 with the hope of completion by December 2025.

Specific item

To help protect the new footway and cycleway surfaces between 196 - 210 Whiteley Way at Whiteley Meadows, we kindly ask residents not to park vehicles on them. Parking on these areas can cause damage to the wearing course, leading to repairs and disruption. Thank you for your cooperation.

Timeline

- 2 Local Centres (north and south) providing up to 2000sqm of flexible space, the local centre on the North have now started with the aim to deliver the local centre's building by the end of Summer 2026.
- Community buildings Opening 2026
- Sports facilities (including pavilion, 2 grass pitches and 2 all-weather pitches), pitch 1 has now been seeded and still on target for delivery in 2026.
- 4 Allotments in total, the first of which is now open
- Cornerstone Primary now open
- Second primary school and secondary school which will be delivered by Hampshire County Council anticipated 2027-28

The sections of water course that runs through the South of the development, along with the storm water ponds serving the development. Fencing, railings or retaining walls located within the communal areas will also be the responsibility of the management company.

Network Coverage

The communication mast has been constructed, BT Openreach have been instructed to connect the network currently we have not been informed with a connection date but rest assured we will be pursing this.



How will the development benefit the local community?

Linden Homes, Countryside Homes & Bovis Homes as part of Vistry Group & all other House Builders at Whiteley Meadows will also support the local community. Vistry Group will be contributing over £25M towards the local area.

- Local Education -Transfer of land including all associated services and utilities for the provision of 2 primary and a secondary school to Hampshire County Council. We will also be contributing £41M to the Council for the delivery of these schools.
- Highways—a contribution of £6M towards local highways and infrastructure, including supporting sustainable transport such as cycle ways and bus stop, traffic management, highway improvements.
- Community Services Contribution of £512K towards refurb or improvement of existing community services in Whiteley or provision of facilities within the new secondary school. This will include employment of Community Development Worker.
- Ecology—A contribution of £390K to local Ecology projects.
- Waste Management –£86K towards providing a local waste/recycling centre.
